Mercy Home's mission has been a work in progress since 1862 when the Sisters of Mercy responded to the needs of five boys left orphaned by a fire. In sheltering those five boys a history of compassionate care began and continues today in our mission.

Under the auspices of the New York State Office of Mental Retardation and Developmental Disabilities Mercy Home operates 12 group homes in Brooklyn and Queens, provides Medicaid Service Coordination, In-Home Respite, Saturday Respite Programs for children, teens and adults, a Day Habilitation in Rosedale Queens, art therapy groups, the Mercy Home-Mitsui USA & Co. Creative Arts Center in Kensington, Brooklyn and the James P. Slattery, CPA, center in Fort Greene, Brooklyn as well as the Mercy Home Performance Band-Melodic Soul.

Our mission "to assure the quality of life for persons with developmental disabilities through the recognition of each person's inherent dignity and absolute right to a life filled with learning and love," inspired us to develop core values by which each of us lives: respecting the dignity of all people, a tenacious pursuit of continuous learning and growth, and fostering an environment of love and compassion.

The sponsorship of the Sisters of Mercy inspires us, our board of directors encourages and supports us, and together with faithful staff we strive to coach and assist each person to reach his/her fullest potential.

The following Core Values are our guiding principles:

Dear Friends,

We have chosen 3 Cs—**Celebrations**, **Challenges**, and **Changes**—to describe Mercy Home's 2008 life. We think those Cs mirror words that describe this past year for our world as well as our country.

Celebrations: What better way to be true to our mission "to assure the quality of life for persons with developmental challenges" than to open new and effective programs for them? This year saw the opening of our second Creative Arts Center (The James P. Slattery, CPA Creative Arts Center) for up to 50 children with autism spectrum disorders. The Center is housed at St. Joseph's College, Brooklyn, and the response of families and their children has been a source of joy and excitement for all of Mercy Home. We also opened a new

group home adjacent to the Convent of Mercy in Brooklyn where 2 women and 4 gentlemen are enjoying getting to know each other and the staff who support them. We cheered after the performance of our band, Melodic Soul at Barnes and Noble in downtown Brooklyn, and for our Direct Support Professionals at a luncheon to honor their fine work. We moved Spirit Day to the grounds of our Administrative Offices in Holy Name Parish which enabled many more families and friends to join in the festivities, food and fun that nurtures and inspires all who attend. And, finally, we expanded our Children's Respite Program and held our first Children's Carnival to bring Respite families and children together.

Challenges: The economic downturn which prompted New York State to freeze funds for new group homes and programs has presented an enormous challenge to Mercy Home and to those aging parents awaiting placement for a son or daughter with special needs. After meeting a number of such families, Mercy Home expected to open a home in Baldwin, Long Island, and was about to purchase another house in Brooklyn when the freeze was announced. It was with a heavy heart that we explained the situation to the families who felt they had found the answer they needed. Of course, we continue to plan, we continue to raise funds on our own, but the challenge to do so is far from met. This has been a significant disappointment to the Mercy Home family. But other challenges were met successfully. We started a great new program called TRAP(The Rhythmic Arts Project), which brings the joy of rhythm and participation through drumming to more and more group homes, and we opened an in-home respite program, where our experienced staff partner with families to teach and guide children with special needs.

Changes: Living well is often about changing, isn't it? In our ongoing effort to create a workplace that is inviting and interesting to all staff, Mercy Home has joined the Sanctuary Model program and has also partnered with St. Vincent's Medical Center to sponsor a wellness program for staff and participants. Our Sanctuary Program's goal is to insure that all staff and participants see themselves as integral to the success of Mercy Home's mission. That means that each one knows that his/her ideas, concerns and thoughts are honored by co-workers and administration. In an evaluation by the organizers of Sanctuary, we were seen as an agency that has enormous strengths and the potential to become even stronger and more responsive to those we serve and employ. We look forward to growing well!

This year, as you can see, has had very steep ups and downs. In a spirit of hope and belief in the goodness of our friends and benefactors, we continue to believe that good things will unfold even in the midst of difficulty. We thank you for your steadfastness and we hold you in our hearts as we face the future together...and united.

- **Visitation Residence** enjoyed anniversary #30 and **Littlejohn #20!** The events brought together present and past residents and staff members as well as neighbors, friends and Board Members in unforgettable evenings of blessing and sharing memories
- The **Children's Respite Program** hosted its first year-end carnival and the children and families are already planning for next year's fun
- Each new program (**Joseph's Residence, the J.P. Slattery Creative Arts Center, and TRAP**) was cause for celebrating the ingenuity of Mercy Home staff and participants and a chance for our newest families to feel at home with the agency
- Some celebrations are bitter-sweet as were the retirement parties for **Jean Carol Nurse** and **Ethel Robinson**, long-time and valued employees. Mercy Home both recalled their wonderful contributions and wished them every happiness in the years to come



- This year, 9 of our 11 houses received **perfect audits** from NY State, who monitors the quality of programs such as ours. This was truly cause for celebration! In addition, minor deficiencies identified in our other programs were promptly corrected.
- Mercy Home initiated its first **"Everyday Heroes-Direct Support Professionals" Luncheon** to honor and recognize the vital work of our dedicated staff. Program participants added their thanks, clapping for staff as our Band, Melodic Soul, performed special numbers dedicated to "their" staff
- **The Annual Music and Arts Festival** brought together families, participants and staff and the flowering garden at the Convent of Mercy was made even more beautiful with the art work displays and Melodic Soul's performance



CHALLENGES

Build character and test an agency's mettle

- **Meeting expenses** in this difficult economic climate has everyone thinking and our Board Members have proved more than up to this challenge. Meanwhile, our staff are looking for ways to streamline to make ends meet
- Our band, **Melodic Soul**, was invited to give a workshop on "The Making of a Band" which highlights the importance of music and group work in the life of persons with intellectual challenges. They met this challenge hands down with presentations at YAI's and Worc's Professional conferences in NYC that were filled to capacity.
- Staff in charge of our Respite Services found ways to expand the **Adult and Children's Programs** so more families could avail themselves of this wonderful experience. Those who attend continue to enjoy activities that teach and include them in the NYC community.



ANGES, CHANGES

- In like manner, **MSC** has added new families to its service who express clear satisfaction with how coordinators help their family member explore their options and attain their desires
- Our Mentors encouraged more participants to come to the twice monthly “**Gifted Artists**” program led by certified art therapists. It is a joy to see participants trying out different art mediums and creating works that bring a smile to everyone’s face
- Our **self-advocacy group** meets weekly and participants meet the challenges of thinking through ideas, talking about relationships, sharing their dreams and building listening skills. Led by Dr. Joe Gioia, psychologist, the group has become a Tuesday night staple.
- Our **Day Hab** program, for those few who need maximum supports to learn and contribute, has helped participants reach out to the community, as they volunteer at the Veteran’s Hospital and St. Clare’s Elementary School in Rosedale, Queens.

CHANGES

Nothing is more inspiring or spirit enhancing than positive change!

- This year, Mercy Home became a **Sanctuary Agency**, after surveying staff and realizing that we can enhance our quest to recognize, honor and invite all staff and participants to share their ideas and expertise.
- The success of our band, **Melodic Soul**, inspired us to initiate **TRAP (The Rhythmic Arts Project)** so that more participants could enjoy and learn from the music they make together with drums and percussion instruments
- The opening of **Joseph’s Residence** in Brooklyn grew the Mercy Home family by 6 with 2 women sharing a supportive apartment and 4 men joining our IRA housing. Both programs share the same building and Sr. Joseph’s prayers and good wishes for success. The home was named to honor this fine Sister of Mercy who has dedicated years to Mercy Home and other ministries reaching out to the homeless.

- Not to be outdone, our **Respite Services** have grown to include more children and a **SECOND Creative Arts Center**, begun in September, is housed at St. Joseph’s College (named the James P. Slattery, CPA Creative Arts Center). This second center is modeled on the **Mercy-Mitsui & Co., USA Center** that has been a huge success over 2007 and 2008. Up to 82 children with autism spectrum disorders can now receive art, music and dance therapy sessions on Saturdays. The positive response of families and children spell **SUCCESS** for this effort.
- From bringing families to Mercy Home’s activities to bringing Mercy Home to family homes has been a real change! **In-home respite**, with staff working with children so parents can learn their techniques, has been a fine experience for all concerned.

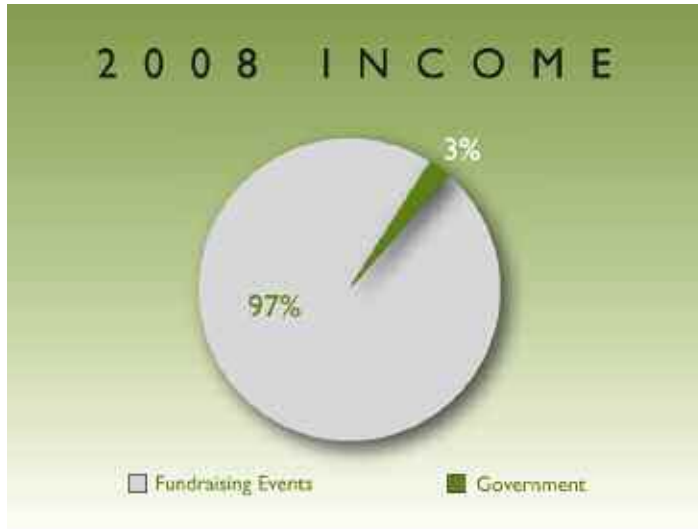
